In the past, the banquet ticket sales typically did not sustain a banquet net zero balance after expenses except for last year. Last year, the extra raffle ticket sold helped the club to remain with a positive bank balance. This year we limited the extra raffle tickets to two (2) each. However, we raised an additional funds helping us offset banquet costs. Barry Barton, WA4HR will be providing the next financial summary this month with more details to be shown in the Longpath newsletter as he had not provided me details at the time of this article. On another note, per the club constitution, the officers will meet to appoint a nominating committee to come up with a slate of officers for next year (2024). If you are selected to serve on this committee, I trust that you will consider those willing to run as an officer for next year that can move the club in a positive direction. I also trust you will

select someone who desires the office(s) and those who can perform the duties for each position sought.

We will not have a meeting in September. At the last meeting, it was announced that our club picnic would be held in September, since the weather in October tends to be cold, blustery, and raining. Suzy and I will be hosting the club picnic on Saturday, 30 September at my QTH in Taft, TN. You can find my address and driving directions on the QRZ web site. The club will provide BBQ Pulled Pork, while Suzy and I will provide plates, napkins, fork/spoons, condiments, etc. We asked that you provide any non-alcoholic drinks, deserts, chips, and other foods you may desire. At the last meeting, many of you

We anticipate eating at 11:30 A.M., so figure on arriving in time to prepare food and eat. I believe some members will bring HF transceivers to operate. We will have some games and might have a pending hay ride using the tractor and wagon [We currently have cotton in the fields and may not be harvested by that time].

If you read further in this newsletter, you will see an article written by Steve Werner, AG4W with news regarding a major DXpedition to occur from 2 November through 15 November with 13 skilled operators operating from Cameroon, Africa (TJ). Steve, AG4W is one of the team members. The team has a license in-hand and will be operating

round -the-clock using CW, SSB, RTTY, and FT8, on the amateur radio HF bands from 160m through 6m, including 2m EME. Steve has requested funding to support this DXpedition. This leads me into the next meeting topic. The club needs to review our DXpedition budget and make plans for DXpedition support for the rest of the year to include support for the TJ9MD DXpedition in November which is just around the corner. I would recommend \$750 as a donation and would like to move out immediately. If you have an objection or need further discussion, send me an email or give me a phone call. This is less risky than Bouvet where we donated a large amount of funds to see the DXpedition fizzle out a few years ago and ended up paying for a boat ride.

The line-up for the remaining months of this year is to vote on DXer of the year, election of officers, analyze the DXpedition budget, and plan our annual Christmas Party in December. These are topics we can discuss at future meetings. So let us have a club picnic in September at AC4G residence, a club meeting in October at the Signals Museum of Information Explosion at 1806 University Drive with a meeting to begin at 6:30 P.M. The October Program will be conducted by Barry Johnson, W4WB. We will also have ZOOM setup for those not able to make it in person. I look forward to seeing you in person at the club picnic in September and the club meeting in October.

I am excited to announce that a new MDXC's (Mediterraneo DX Club) expedition is coming very soon. This year we are heading to western Africa, to one of the biggest countries facing the Guinea's Gulf, silent since 2018: TJ – Cameroon.



The MDXC Italian staff faced a long significant effort to obtain the commercial import permit for each transceiver and, even more time and frustration to get the Amateur Radio License... but "who endures wins" and September 1 the signed paper for TJ9MD is in IZ8CCW's hands. The 13 skilled operators of the expeditionary team (IZ8CCW, IZ2GNQ, F6IRA, OK2WX, AG4W, DL8JJ, IZ4COW, IU3PMA, HB9DHG, HB9TOC, ON7RN, IK5BOH and IZ4UEZ) are thrilled about the happy results of MDXC's efforts, and now they are eager


to bring back that big African country on the radio waves: starting from 2 November till the 15 November, from Kribi, on Atlantic Ocean shores. At least four stations will be on air "round the clock" on CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8, 160 through 6m. Isn't enough? On top of that, after the great experience during J28MD, for the Moon Bounce enthusiasts an E.M.E. station will offer a chance to increase their 2m DXCC with this New One. This DXpedition has the same leadership and some of the same operators that made over 90,000 QSOs from J28MD.

While the team starts to pack their luggage, you should start to plan to raise your antennas and warm-up the rigs... Stay tuned for more news!

I request that NADXC help sponsor this DXpedition. The club can look forward to another exciting presentation after I return.
