From the President

You can find his name/callsign on the ARRL website (www.arrl.org). It is great to know that the NADXC has two members (K3FRK and AG4W) on the approved Card Checker list. I look forward to bringing more paper QSL cards to be checked. Remember, in order to do so, you must first enter your QSL card information using the ARRL DXCC Online Application form, make your payment, schedule a time with either K3FRK or AG4W and bring printout, QSL cards, and stamped envelope to one of our NADXC meetings or hamfests in the area for submission. that you can immediately take your cards home after the card checkers have processed your QSL cards.

Thanks to our members who have already paid their 2024 dues. I want to remind our membership of the easy process to renew 2024 NADXC dues by following the link to PayPal on our NADXC club website (www.nadxc.org), where each member can renew their membership by paying their dues. One other method to pay dues is to pay the NADXC club Secretary/Treasurer Mr. Barry Barton, WA4HR at our next club meeting with cash or check or by sending a check to Barry's QRZ address. Member dues are our main conduit to paying for operating costs and funding DXpeditions that we all enjoy working throughout the year.

I trust you all have been active on the amateur bands. This past weekend (March 30 and 31) was the 2024 CQ WPX SSB Contest. I was amazed how strong signals were on 10m into Asia. I operated 10m Single band. With the family visiting from out of town, I was only able to operate a couple hours Friday evening and a couple hours on Saturday evening before the band closed each night. We apparently had an opening from my QTH in Taft, TN directly to China, because all I worked Friday evening was primarily Chinese stations, a few Japanese stations, a few Philippine stations, and a Hong Kong station or two. The Chinese stations were extremely strong and my 100-watt, Low Power entry station was able to work every one of them that I received, approximately thirty BY's, BD's, BG's, BH's, etc. I was amazed that most Chinese station signals were S9 plus 20 dB on the 10m band. I sure hope many of our members were able to take advantage of the recent band openings and especially by working DX stations via Single Sideband this past weekend in this contest.

Our April meeting will be held April 9 at 6:30 P.M. at the Signals Museum of Information Explosion (MIE) located at 1806 University Drive, Huntsville, AL where there are over 1100 classic antique radios on display. We have new and old business to discuss. We will also have a good program after our business meeting given by Krish, W4VKU on the Lakshadweep and Andaman Islands DXpeditions that occurred this past December. I am looking forward to this program and hope everyone can make the meeting in-person. I hope to see many of you at the club meeting and hear the DX you all have recently worked. We will also have ZOOM up and running for those of you who cannot make it in-person.

March 2024 Meeting Minutes by Bruce Smith, AC4G

NADX Meeting Minutes - March 12th, 2024

The North Alabama DX Club (NADXC) President, Bruce Smith (AC4G) called the March 2024 NADXC meeting to order at 6:31 P.M. He welcomed all members and guests and asked for any visitors. There were no visitors or guests in attendance.

Next, Bruce, AC4G stated that we have some business to discuss and also have a great program. He said that one of the exciting parts of our meeting is reviewing DX worked this past month by our members. Bruce, AC4G quickly reviewed the sign-in sheets and announced DX worked by members that had listed the prefixes of all DX worked since the last club meeting. Bruce, AC4G suggested that there was some good DX worked.

Next, the club President, Bruce Smith said he had a few announcements. He began with the annual club dues stating that all members should pay their NADXC dues as soon as possible. He also thanked all of the members who had already paid their 2024 dues. Bruce, AC4G also stated that the easiest way to pay is via PayPal via the link on our webpage, scroll down and you can choose individual or family membership. If preferred, members can pay Barry Barton, WA4HR in person or mail a check to WA4HR's QRZ address.

Bruce, AC4G then asked how many read the Longpath. Several hands were raised, but not everybody. He said there were some great articles by: N4BCD, AG4W, N5DF, and AC4G as well as our regular sections provided by N4NM and K3FRK. Bruce encouraged more members to

write articles.

Bruce, AC4G asked that we approve last month's meeting minutes published in the Longpath. The minutes were approved. It was suggested the meeting minutes in the future provide more details. Next, Bruce mentioned that since our Secretary/Treasurer, Barry Barton, WA4HR was absent and that the bank had deleted our account in error, that the Financial Report would be the same as last months, especially since no deposits were made this month due to the bank account issues. Bruce, AC4G will request Barry, WA4HR provide more meeting details in the monthly meeting minutes in the future.

Next, the NADXC President, Bruce Smith began discussing OLD Business. He began by bringing forth a DXpedition funding request for Bouvet Island (3YOK), which was tabled last month. AC4G gave a summary of a recent letter sent by Bouvet expedition team leader, LASGIA. Discussions were slow to start, but AC4G proposed we donate \$200 for the Bouvet DXpedition. John Stensby, N5DF objected. He stated that the website and the email from LASGIA summarized by AC4G did not indicate if the transportation had been finalized. N5DF also stated that the typical major club sponsors had not contributed yet. After more discussion and dissatisfaction with 3YOK details, the decision to fund this DXpedition was tabled until AC4G can get more information, so the club can make a final decision to fund or not to fund. Next, the Liberia (A80K) DXpedition was discussed. AC4G was open to fund \$50-\$100, but not a single member supported this suggestion. Therefore, it was decided not to fund A80K DXpedition. Lastly, Pitcairn Island (VP6G) was discussed since AC4G had received a request for funding. AC4G suggested the NADXC send either

\$50 or \$100 to this group. Again, no member expressed positive favor to fund, therefore, it was decided no funding be provided to the VP6G DXpedition with NADXC funding. Members seemed to favor holding funding for future DXpeditions.

The next topic of old business was initially brought up at last month's February meeting. Chris Arthur, NV4B mentioned last month that we should fill the position formerly held by Mike Maples, K4ADK (Silent Key) for QSL Card Checker. AC4G said that two NADXC members expressed interest since February's meeting. However, before the March meeting, one member conceded to relinquish his nomination to the other interested member. Therefore, the NADXC nominated Fred Kepner (K3FRK) to become the club's appointed DXCC checker along with current QSL Card Checker, Steve Werner, AG4W, who had just checked cards at the Tullahoma, TN hamfest this past weekend. Chris, NV4B said he would contact Southeastern Division Director, Mr. Mickey Baker, N4MB to pass along this nomination and find out if anything else needs to be done to complete this appointment. There was no other old business.

Next, Bruce Smith, AC4G opened the floor for NEW business. Bruce first topic was providing a rundown on this year's banquet speaker. Bruce gave a quick report on progress made since last meeting on the banquet speaker. Bruce had received a suggestion to ask Paul, N6PSE. Paul stated he was unavailable but thanked the club for the consideration. Next, Bruce contacted Don Greenbaum, N1DG who has also many years of DXpedition experience. Don replied and stated that in mid-August (the time of our banquet) he would be operating from Jarvis Island. Bruce said

he would keep him on stand-by for future banquets. Bruce, AC4G also sent a request to Hal Turley, W8HC, but had not received any response as of this meeting.

On another note, Bruce, AC4G stated that Bob, K8KI; Chuck, N4NM; and Bruce, AC4G moved and inventoried equipment from the estate of Mike Maples, K4ADK that his daughter and son gave to the club. An equipment list was generated and will next have prices associated with each item. Once the list and pricing are completed, the list will be provided first to the NADXC in case any members would like to purchase any of K4ADK's equipment. Afterwards, the list will be provided to HARC, then the remaining equipment will be sold at hamfests. All proceeds will go to the NADXC. Bruce, AC4G hope to make the equipment list available soon to the NADXC membership.

One additional new business item was suggested by Jim, NK3V. Jim asked if we had ever considered a section in the Longpath newsletter to sell amateur radio equipment. Some stated we had included a section to sell equipment. Most recently, Bob DePierre had attempted to sell some estate equipment in a "For Sale" section in the Longpath, but no one ever contacted him. Bob even tried giving away old equipment, but could never do so. Therefore, this "For Sale" eventually went by the wayside. Next, Jim, NK3V suggested perhaps every quarter and prior to our club meeting, we could have a tailgate in the parking lot to sell or for member to purchase used gear. No further discussion was made, but the club applauds Jim suggestions to help make the club more eventful and exciting. Perhaps we can get the tailgate started in the next month or so. Thanks, Jim, for the ideas!! (AC4G)

There were no addition new business items to discuss.

Finally, Bruce, AC4G called for adjourn-

In summary, the simplicity to upload one's "ADIF" file in early-January of each year, allows any DXer the freedom to enter their log for this DX Marathon competition in any one of several categories. North Alabama DX Club (NADXC) "Club Fact Sheet"

Who We Are: NADXC is a group of active radio amateurs with a deep compassion for working DX, contesting, and other aspects of Amateur Radio. We welcome everyone who is interested in joining our club. NADXC members are active in all facets of DX and contesting. The NADXC also donates funding for various DXpeditions all over the world. The NADXC sponsors a DX Banquet in mid-August of every year in conjunction with the Huntsville Hamfest in Huntsville, Alabama. NADXC members moderate various programs at club meetings and during the Huntsville Hamfest, covering amateur radio technical and operating topics for all to learn and enjoy. The NADXC sponsors a prestigious award at the end of year for the most deserving DXer of the Year from the NADXC club.

DX Funding Policy: The policy supports major DX peditions that meet our requirements for financial sponsorship. Details are available on the NADXC website and in the "Longpath" newsletter.

Club History: The NADXC was organized in December 1966 by a group of 12 charter members. The original constitution was adopted and signed on December 19, 1966. The first chairman was Dan Whitsett, W4BRE (SK). In the early-1970's, the NADXC was custodian of the W4, K4 QSL Bureau which became such a huge undertaking that it eventually was passed to other larger clubs. In January of 1977, the club bought a VHF repeater for sharing DX spots and hosting a weekly net on Wednesday nights. The repeater was located on Redstone Arsenal, Weeden Mountain using the frequencies of 147.91/147.31 MHz on two meters. Today, the repeater has been relocated and utilizes the frequencies of 147.90/147.30 MHz, with a callsign of W4QB. The weekly net has been discontinued. In 1980, the club started the monthly newsletter known as the "Longpath" which currently continues to be produced every month.

While organized as a DX club, NADXC members are active in all aspects of the hobby. We trust that this information will be of interest to all and hope all hams have a long and pleasant association with the NADXC.

Requirements for Membership: The NADXC welcomes all hams radio operators who have an interest in DXing. It does not matter whether you are a new ham, a seasoned ham operator, an old-timer to DXing, or a ham who has just been hit with the DX bug; everyone is welcome! See the club website: www.nadxc.org. Dues are paid in January of every year.

Meetings: The NADX club meets the second Tuesday night of every month, with the current location at the Signals Museum of Information Explosion (MIE) located at 1806 University Drive, Huntsville, Alabama and virtually via Zoom. Some members gather early to eat their dinner, socialize, discuss DX worked, and then we have a short business meeting starting at 6:30 P.M. CT. followed by an exciting, interesting program to help, entertain, and teach members about DX and amateur radio in general.

Club Officers: There are four elected officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer) and three elected directors on the NADXC Board of Directors. The current roster of club officers and directors can be seen of the NADXC web site or in the "Longpath" newsletter, which is uploaded each month to the club website.

Website: The NADXC club maintains a website at <u>www.nadxc.org</u>. This site provides club information and activities throughout the year about a variety of subjects related to the club, DX, and amateur radio.
